BACKGROUND

During the period from 1992 to 1995, 2.2 million persons or more than half of the pre-war population domiciled in the country fled from their homes in Bosnia and Herzegovina. Among them 1.2 million left the country to seek refugee protection abroad in more than 100 countries world-wide whilst approximately one million persons were displaced within the country. Aside from the devastating human impact of the war, nearly 500 000 homes, or almost half of all housing units in the country, were either partially or completely destroyed.

It is estimated that around 750 000 persons who left the country and registered as refugees abroad, still live outside Bosnia and Herzegovina. Most of them have been integrated in their host countries, however nearly 30 000 individuals are still in need of durable solutions, which may include their repatriation to Bosnia and Herzegovina.

Some 29 000 applications for housing assistance in the RHP framework have been received from those wishing to return and those wishing to integrate in the local communities.

RHP OBJECTIVES IN BIH

The Regional Housing Programme (RHP) in Bosnia and Herzegovina is expected to provide durable and sustainable housing solutions to several categories of vulnerable refugees, internally displaced persons (IDPs) and returnees either in their places of origin, places of displacement or within institutions of the social welfare system. In all, 5 400 households (or 14 000 individuals) should be assisted.

LATEST ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Mr Fehim Gondžić lives with his wife and three children in Olovo. The family's only source of income is the disability pension they receive for their son. Their house was completely reconstructed thanks to the RHP, enabling them to finally settle in their new home.

8 more families from Olovo moved in their newly constructed homes, as well as 10 families in Gorazde and 6 families in Foca, FBiH. In addition, 20 families who received building material packages in Banja Luka, Prijedor, Gradiška and Trebinje in RS, have also finally obtained a durable housing solution.


Construction of 438 flats in multiapartment buildings for refugees and IDPs.





The other donors are the USA, Germany, Italy, Norway, Switzerland, Denmark, Turkey, Luxembourg, Cyprus, Romania, Czech Republic, Slovak Republic and Hungary.
