#### **BACKGROUND**

An estimated 550 000 people were displaced within Croatia during 1991-1992. Over the 1992-1995 period, the country received approximately 400 000 refugees from Bosnia and Herzegovina, of which an estimated 120 000 have since acquired Croatian citizenship. In the period from 1991 to 1995, some 250 000 minority Serbs fled Croatia. The authorities have to date registered 133 140 returnees of Serbian ethnicity to and within Croatia, representing around half of those who fled their places of origin.


The Regional Housing Programme (RHP) in Croatia aims to provide durable housing solutions to several categories of refugees, internally displaced persons (IDPs) and returnees either in their places of origin or places of displacement, as well as within institutions of the social welfare system.

To date, 350 housing units have been delivered to approximately 760 most-vulnerable persons in Croatia, equating to approximately 87% of the total objective of 402 homes.
